Dear FCJ College community,

Last week we celebrated the final day of classes for our Year 12 cohort of 2023. It was a wonderful day filled with both joy and nostalgia as the students farewelled what they have known for some 13 years. Then this week saw the commencement of the VCE exams and the final chapter of their time with us. We are mightily proud of this cohort and all their achievements. Below are the words I offered the Year 12 cohort during their final assembly.

For some of you today, you will be feeling delighted that this is the last day of school – we won't take it personally – but no doubt there will be some joy at finishing, some delight at leaving all the routine and all the habit behind, that is a normal reaction. But for some of you today, there will be a tinge of sadness too. This is also natural – something that has been such a constant in your life is coming to an end, making lunches, packing school bags, doing homework – it's all coming to an end. It's almost like grieving and that too is a normal reaction.

Yesterday, Mr Mount and I spoke to the Year 12s reminding them that they are zooming towards the final time they will be gathered together at school as a group. We asked them to consider the legacy they wish to leave here, but also what they will take from FCJ as they head out into the world. When reflecting on this, and listening to Laura and Georgia's speeches this morning, I am reminded of something I heard this year that I would like to share with you all. When I was studying in the US earlier this year, one of my fellow students said something that really resonated with me. He was a priest from Columbia and we were talking about where we find God in our lives. He was telling me a story about going on a silent retreat - now that's where you literally go away from home, family, friends, technology and stay silent - simply no speaking. To anyone. Nothing. He was reflecting on how difficult this was for the first few days, and then how it got easier over time. He said that he found himself praying and thinking a lot - and after a few days he discovered that most of the time, he was thinking about his friends and loved ones. He noticed that his thoughts were about other people - wondering what they were doing and considering his relationships with them. He came to the realisation, that for him, that is where he finds his God. God is present in the connections he has with others. In other words, in his relationships with other people, where there is love, there is God.

I look around here this morning, and I think he's right. God can be found here in the connections you have forged with each other at FCJ College.

Those connections that you have made at FCJ College go with you today – not just in the friendships you have formed, but in the little moments that you have experienced across your time here. Whether you joined us in Year 12, or have been here from Year 7, all of you have had moments of connection – perhaps it was running the relay in Year 9 and passing the baton to your mate, maybe it was smiling at a Cooinda resident during Let's Find our Voice in Year 7, it might have been carrying a pack for a mate on a hike in outdoor ed, or maybe it was just being a friend and listening to someone who was having a tough time.

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These are the moments I think you'll remember. These are the moments that stay with you years after you finish school. Trust me, you'll forget the colour of the walls in the classroom, you'll forget where you finished in the swimming carnival, and you'll forget some of the names of your peers (it's true). But those little moments of connection they will stick with you, and you will carry them with you beyond this place.

But importantly, while you take those connections with you, some of them will also remain here with us. You are part of a FCJ tradition that is 123 years old. You have left an indelible mark on the story of our school. It is forever changed because of your presence, and we believe it is a better place because you were here. We are mightily proud of you - and as I said yesterday, we send you out with full confidence in the people you have grown into and the people you will continue to become. The world is full of division and distress at the moment. Perhaps what the world needs is more moments of connection. So go out there, go and be the face of God to all those people you will meet. Inspire them. Challenge them. Allow them to see the good in you and the hope you provide the world. You've got a special role to play in making our local community a better place, our nation a better place and of course, as you start travelling, our world a better place.

Remember the choices you've made and the lessons you've learned here – they will stand you in good stead for the wide world out there. As Marie Madeleine said: never say "I can't do that" because we all have faith that you can, and faith that you will.

Space Teams Academy Competition

Armed with a set of thought-provoking questions, they embarked on a journey of self-discovery and mutual understanding.

In addition, we organised a 'speed conversation' activity where students engaged in one-minute dialogues with a partner across from them. Science is cool because we get to do something different each lesson and I love using microscopes, both digital and monocular microscopes.




This summer camp invites young adults, students, and young professionals aged 18-35 from Australia to connect "head, heart and hands" and explore the call to care for our common home.
