Dear FCJ College community,

Welcome to Term 2! Over the past few weeks, I have been thinking a great deal about the role of schools and the potential impact of schools on the lives of students and the community. A lot is said and written about achievement in school – what is the highest ATAR this year, what is the median study score and how many students achieve an ATAR of 90+. These wonderful efforts deserve to be celebrated and recognised, but they should not be the only aspect upon which a school is judged. Achievement and success is much more nuanced than this.

My thinking has been influenced by my life-changing time in the Philippines with the group of students over the Easter Holidays, but also thanks to the wonderful experiences already shared this term: the commencement of the Let's Find Our Voice Rehearsals, Year 12 Retreat, Meet the Principal Mornings and ANZAC Day Commemorations.

What strikes me about all these events is that the students are not in the classroom for any of them, yet the learning is often the most impactful, most significant and often the most transformational. I will write more about my time in the Philippines once the students have completed their post-trip workshop and presented to their families, but it would be fair to say it was one of the highlights of my professional life. Watching students in the classroom make connections and 'get it' is always a thrill, seeing 15 students have their eyes opened to the world and how many in the world live, was simply a privilege I won't forget.




Back at school we have seen our wonderful FCJ College students dive in quickly and take up the opportunity to push themselves beyond their comfort zone – and do things they would never usually contemplate (sing in public, allow peers to make a plaster mask of your face, read a poem at the Dawn Service). Our FCJ College students have shown time and time again, that they are prepared and in fact keen, to learn from their experiences and learn from their peers.

They are also prepared to share their experiences. The Meet the Principal mornings should really be re-named to Meet the Student mornings because our tour guides have 'wowed' our visitors. The guests gush about how wonderful the hosts were and how much they love their school. Nothing makes me more proud than hearing this – our students are our best ambassadors and it's clear they love being here at FCJ College and learning in and outside the classroom.

Benalla Heritage Festival

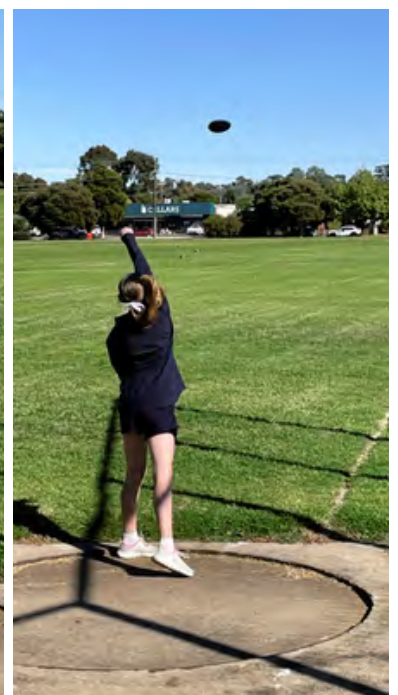

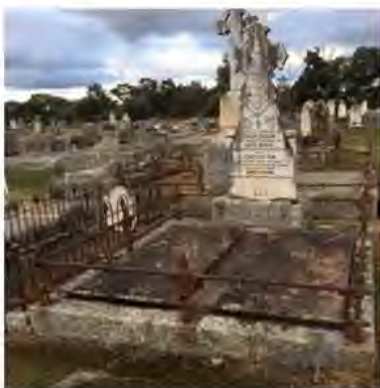

Youth Outreach Recovery Support (YORS)

What is Youth Outreach Recovery Support (YORS)?

Youth Outreach Recovery Support (YORS) is a Mental Health Community Support Service (MHCSS) for young people aged 16-25 years who are experiencing mental health symptoms or significant psychological distress. It will be delivered by existing Youth Residential Recovery (YRR) service providers across Victoria.

YORS is funded by the Department of Health to provide young people with short to medium term flexible outreach wellbeing support to help them to better manage their mental health, develop practical life skills for independent living and self-care, engage in community life, access other health and social support services they need, and make the journey towards recovery and the life they want.

Who will benefit from YORS?

YORS is for young people aged 16-25 years in Victoria, who are experiencing mental health symptoms or significant psychological distress.

It will complement, but not duplicate, case management supports the young person may be receiving from other service providers (e.g. area mental health services, youth justice, out of home care and homelessness providers) by providing a psychosocial therapeutic response tailored to the needs of the young person. This includes providing young people with some access to the YRR group programs and activities on a day basis. This support can also be provided before or after a YRR bed-based placement.

How do you refer to YORS?

Young people can self-refer to YORS. With the young person's consent, referrals can also be made by family members or carers, schools, youth services, GPs, private and public mental health clinicians, headspace, Prevention and Recovery Care Services (PARCS), as well as health and social support services such as those related to: homelessness, justice, out of home care, and substance use or addiction.
